What does Movie Night involve?

- **FREE** and **ACCESSIBLE** showings of *Crip Camp: A Disability Revolution* on the big screen, in English and Spanish!
- **FREE entry, popcorn, raffle, onsite childcare and resources** from community groups like PCVU, the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), Peace of Mind Pacific County and more
- **Guided post-film conversations** in English and Spanish for folks to talk about the movie and what disability justice could look like in Pacific County!

What is Crip Camp?

- **An exciting, inspiring documentary following a group of disabled disability rights organizers** from attending summer camp together as teens to helping win civil rights for disabled folks in the United States
- Rated R (because fighting for our rights isn't PG!)

Who's invited?

- **EVERYONE ages 14+** is welcome to watch and stick around for discussion; bring your friends, family, neighbors, etc.!
- **Youth under 17 need parent/guardian permission** to attend (due to R rating)

- Youth who attend in groups of 4+ get extra FREE raffle tickets!
